FEES AND METHODS OF PAYMENT 2014/2015 Academic Year

When accepting an offer of a place on an MA programme, you will be asked to pay a non-refundable registration fee of £100 to secure your place.

The fee for each of the three years of either of the MA programmes for students starting in 2012 is £1950, so the total fee for 3 years (excluding the registration fee) is £5850.

(Please note that the MA in Christian Approaches to Leadership programme has an added fee of £100 for the personality questionnaire exercise during the Personal Development optional module, which is to be paid before the start of that module, if selected.)

The fee for extending the period of study beyond the three year period of study is currently £525 per year (see Extension of Study Period below).

Fees are due at the beginning of September of each year. At the beginning of your programme, you can pay in full, which attracts a £150 discount if paid before 1 September 2013, or spread the payment of fees over the 3 years. If a student withdraws during the year, the fees due will be either the cost of the number of individual modules/dissertation started or the cost of number of academic years started, whichever is the greater.

The fees include classes, supervision, assessment, administration and use of the library.

The fee does not include meals or accommodation, for which a separate charge is made in advance of any module and payable, at the latest, two weeks before the start of the module. Modules can be taken on a residential or non-residential basis and the current package prices are £210 (en-suite), £170 (standard) and £47 (non-residential) respectively. The College regrets that it cannot refund meals or accommodation not taken up. **Note:** all fees and prices will be reviewed at the beginning of July each year.

You may pay the fees for the programme by one of the following four methods:

1. **By one lump sum of £5850*.**

*If the whole fee for the programme is paid before 1 September 2014, there is a discount of £150 i.e. £5700 to pay. (NB: only available to students in their first year.) Please make your payment payable to '**Sarum College**'.

2. **Three annual instalments of £1950.**

The instalments are payable:

1 September 2014, 1 September 2015, 1 September 2016.

(Please note that the MA in Christian Approaches to Leadership programme has an added fee of £100 for the personality questionnaire exercise during the Personal Development optional module, which is to be paid before the start of that module, if selected.)

3. Six instalments of £975

The instalments are payable:

1 September 2014, 1 March 2015, 1 September 2015, 1 March 2016,
1 September 2016 and 1 March 2017.

4. Twenty six instalments: 1 payment of £975, then twenty-five payments of £195.

The instalments are payable:

One initial payment of £975, payable 1 September 2014; then:
£195 payable 1 February 2015, 1 March 2015, 1 April 2015, 1 May 2015 and
1 June 2015.

2015.16 (ten payments)

£195 payable 1 September 2015, 1 October 2015, 1 November 2015, 1 December 2015, 1
January 2016, 1 February 2016, 1 March 2016, 1 April 2016, 1 May 2016 and 1 June
2016.

2016.17 (ten payments)

£195 payable 1 September 2016, 1 October 2016, 1 November 2016, 1 December 2016, 1
January 2017, 1 February 2017, 1 March 2017, 1 April 2017, 1 May 2017 and 1 June
2017.

(Please note that the MA in Christian Approaches to Leadership programme has an added fee of £100 for the personality questionnaire exercise during the Personal Development optional module, which is to be paid before the start of that module, if selected.)

Withdrawal From Study

If you withdraw from the course, you will be charged the full year fees for the number of years of study that you have commenced, plus any additional modules over and above 3 modules in year one, 6 modules in year two and 6 modules and the dissertation in year three. The date of withdrawal will be the date of receipt of a formal notification of withdrawal by the validating university.

Extension to Period of Study

The fees are calculated on the following basis:

Postgraduate Certificate (60 credits)

Completed within 1 year of starting the course.

Postgraduate Diploma (120 credits)
Completed within 2 years of starting the course.

Masters Degree (180 credits)
Completed within 3 years of starting the course.

If you wish to extend your period of study beyond these periods there will be a charge of £525 per year of extension and will apply as follows :

Postgraduate Certificate – extension beyond 1 September 2015
Postgraduate Diploma – extension beyond 1 September 2016
Masters Degree – extension beyond 1 September 2017

Permission to extend modules and the dissertation must be applied for and granted by the Programme Leader.

Audit Fees

Students may attend modules in addition to those which they are studying for credit, by permission of the Programme Leader. The hospitality rates will be the usual student rates of £210 (en-suite), £170 (standard) and £47 (non-residential) respectively, with an added administration fee of £20 per booking. Please note that students must give clear information on whether they are attending modules as part of their accredited study in advance of attendance. Should the module be oversubscribed, preference will be given to students taking the module for credit.

Note: all fees and prices will be reviewed at the beginning of July each year.

Other Costs

Please be aware that there will be other costs incurred by studying at Sarum College. Books may need to be purchased and the student must have access to, and be able to use, computer equipment (e.g. a PC/Mac and MS Word software) as well as being able to regularly access the Internet. In addition, the requirements of submitting the dissertation involves printing and binding hard-copies (two) of the dissertation, for which there will be a fee payable direct to the binding company (as sourced by the student independently).

The three Trusts formerly known as the Central Deaconess House Trust Fund, the St Andrews House Fund and the Church of England Deaconess Fund have now been amalgamated, and are governed by a scheme known as the Women's Continuing Ministerial Education Trust. The object of the WCMET is to further the Continuing Ministerial Education of women in the Church of England and the Scottish Episcopal Church by means of grants to ordained women, female Accredited Lay Workers (including Church Army sisters) and religious sisters (lay or ordained) who, in the opinion of the Trustees, are in need of financial assistance.

The Trustees' policy is to assist their work and professional ministry in areas that go beyond normal diocesan financial responsibilities or where normal diocesan resources are insufficient, for example in-service training, academic study, sabbaticals and travel. Applications should be made on the form provided. Applications will normally be considered quarterly, at the end of: March, June, September and December.

The Sarum St Michael Educational Charity is a trust formed from the assets of an Anglican college of education that closed in Salisbury in 1979.

Our aim is to advance the work in education originally done by the college. We make grants to individuals ineligible for student loans to help them pursue their further education.

We offer bursaries to intended teachers of Religious Education. We help schools pay for resources for teaching RE, and parishes pay for books and equipment for Sunday schools, youth clubs and the like.

Grants are made within a wide geographical area consisting of the Diocese of Salisbury and all of the adjacent dioceses, except that schools and parishes must be based in the Diocese of Salisbury
